

For incoming students of the Kyoto prefectural senior high schools

Tuitions and fees for the first year of incoming students are as follows, although the amounts slightly vary according to the school. Tuition (lesson) fees, miscellaneous fees and textbook fees are charged for the second year and beyond.

In order so that the fulfillment of these desires is not restricted by financial constraints, Kyoto Prefecture has established a multi-tiered support system. As detailed in article 97 of the Japanese constitution, 'fundamental human rights are the fruit of years of effort by mankind for freedom'. Likewise, this support system has been made possible due to the efforts of our predecessors.

Those interested in receiving support should first consult with their guardians and teachers and then make full use of the system in order to open up your future and create a society in which mutual human rights are respected.

Objectives: Provide financial support for education and child rearing for the welfare of single-mother families

Loan/Grant: Grant

Eligibility: Single-mothers of Kyoto Prefecture (excludes Kyoto City) raising toddlers that have yet to start elementary school

Grant amount: 11,000 yen (annually)

Project name: Private kindergartens and childcare subsidy

Operating body: Kyoto Prefecture

Objectives: To reduce the financial expenses for the guardian of sending their infants to private kindergartens and to promote infant education

Loan/Grant: Grant

Eligibility: The following two points must both apply -

1. Infants registered at private kindergartens in Kyoto, Shiga, Hyogo or Nara prefectures as of October 1 of the corresponding academic year (or January 1 for three-year olds or above)
2. Guardians paying for daycare who are residents of Kyoto Prefecture and pay taxes of less than 7,110 yen

Grant amount: 17,000 yen (annually)

This figure applies only when the annual daycare expenses exceed 17,000-yen

Application period: For 3-5 year olds (3 year olds must have turned 3 by the start of the academic year in April) September - October period

For 3 year olds (3 year olds who turn 3 during the corresponding academic year)
December - January

Application documents: Application form, proof of income

Period of grant payment: 3-5 year olds (3 year olds must have turned 3 by the start of the academic year in April) December - January

3 year olds (3 year olds who turn 3 during the corresponding academic year) Around March
