





Introduction

There've been more international tourists lately.




Then, let's take lots of photos! Now it's time to do some research!

That's a good idea!




It's a pretty spot with facilities such as an exercise and lawn area.



Kamogawa Park was developed on the riverbed of the Kamogawa River, which runs through the center of Kyoto city!


Kamogawa Park Square

Kamogawa Park (Kojinguchi)




Some stepping stones are in the shapes of turtles.

Near this park, we have...




Shimogamo Shrine, a historic area which nurtured Kyoto's traditions and culture.






