# **Fundamental national policy**

# [Revision of the medical care provision system] (It was decided by the governmental task force meeting on March 10<sup>th</sup>,2023)


- Shifting from a special response by a limited number of medical institutions with administrative involvement, to a regular autonomous response by a wide range of medical institutions
- In addition to the continued support of current medical institutions, we will focus on efforts to encourage the participation of additional medical institutions.
- Strongly encourage the maintenance and expansion of corresponding medical institutions through the formulation of "transition plans" carried out by each prefecture, and support for equipment development, etc.
- The coordination of hospitalizations, including the securing of hospital beds, has been moved from being coordinated by the government to a system based on coordination among medical institutions, in which medical institutions determine the need for hospitalization as they do for other illnesses.

# [Other related measures] (It was decided by the governmental task force meeting on January 27th, 2023)

• With the downgrade to a Category 5 infectious disease, the various measures implemented under the Special Measures Law, such as requesting cooperation from residents and businesses, etc. regarding infection control measures, will be terminated.


# National policy in response to the downgrade to Category 5 ①

#### As of today's task force meeting, the following is decided.
