# Outline of the state of emergency in Kyoto Prefecture

- I. Area: All over Kyoto Prefecture
- II. Duration: September 13th, 2021 to September 30th, 2021
- III. Contents: (The ongoing measures will continuously be implemented.)
  - 1. Refrain from outings
  - 2. Restrictions on organizing events
  - 3. Restrictions on facility usages
  - 4. Requests to business operators regarding commuting to work.
  - 5. Requests to public transportation operators, etc.
  - Measures will be implemented in accordance with the guidance issued by the central government.

# Ⅲ. Contents

## 1. Refrain from outings

(Requests based on Article 45 Clause 1 of the Special Measures Law)

- Based upon a sharp increase of virus transmission, reduce your outings to crowded places by at least half.
- Refrain from non-essential and non-urgent outings both at day and night.
   Particularly, if it isn't necessary or urgent, refrain from going out after 8 p.m.
- If it is necessary to go out, try to act with the minimum number of people who are either family members or people you are usually together with, and avoid both crowded places and times.
- Do not visit restaurants or bars that do not practice prevention measures nor comply with the shortening of business hours.
- Avoid cross-prefecture travel such as non-essential and non-urgent visits home as well as refrain from non-essential and non-urgent travelling as much as possible to areas where the infection cases are increasing.
- Avoid drinking alcohol with others on the street or at parks as it could raise the infection risk.

(Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law)

- Refrain from visiting medical institutes or elderly care centers.
- Refrain from commuting, going to school, or participating in any social activities if you have symptoms such as a fever, etc.
- Regardless of whether having been vaccinated or not, wear a mask properly, wash your hands frequently and disinfect your fingers.
- If anyone whom you live with tests positive for the virus, and if you
  may have had close contact with them, all others living with said
  individual should stay home for 14 days.
- Refrain from talking when on public transport.
- Promote a workplace environment where employees with concerns about their physical conditions do not have to hesitate to take a dayoff.

# 2. Restrictions on organizing events

(Request based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law) Request to comply with the following criteria for event organizers:

【Upper limit of the number of people】 5,000 people or less

[Capacity rates] 50% of maximum capacity or less

If accommodation capacity is not fixed, secure distances between persons

(at least 1m, and as wide as possible)

【Operating hours】 Until 9 pm

Upper limit of the number of people:

Either a maximum 5,000 people or 50% of accommodation capacity – whichever is smaller.

If an event involves nationwide movements of people, or more than 1,000 participants, an event organizer must consult with the Kyoto Prefectural Consultation Office in advance.

### 3. Restrictions on facility usage

#### Requests to restaurants and bars

(Requests based on Article 45 Clause 2 of the Special Measures Law)

\*\*Facilities that are expected to be used for the purpose of staying for a long time during nighttime, such as Internet cafes and manga cafes, are not subject to these requests. However, request to limit the number of people entering the facility at one time and to refrain from serving alcohol and offering karaoke services.

#### [Requests for operation]

(Requests based on Article 45 Clause 2)

- Encourage check-ups for employees.
- Guide customers accordingly to prevent infection, deny entry of visitors with a fever or other symptoms.
- Install equipment for hand disinfecting and ensure proper ventilation of the facility.
- Provide information on infection preventions measures, such as wearing a mask, to customers.
- Prohibit entry by customers who are not complying with prevention measures, for example wearing a mask, without a valid reason, and request customers who are within facilities and not complying with prevention measures without a valid reason to leave the premises.
- Prevent droplet infections through the installation of acrylic partitions, and ensure social distancing, etc.

(Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9)

- Install CO2 sensors, and comply with industry guidelines.
- Take thorough infection prevention measures (comply thoroughly with guidelines per industry) (Not based on the Special Measures Law but strongly encouraged)
- To make information public, such as entry arrangements for prevention of transmission, through URLs

### (2) Request to establishments other than restaurants and bars

①Arrangement of visitors

(Requests based on Article 45 Clause 2 of the Special Measures Law )

•Managements who are in charge of large commercial buildings with over 1,000m of space, manage the number of visitors through methods such as counting, restricting entry, and guiding entry. (Referred to as "arrangement of visitors")

(Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law )

- Managements with basement grocery sections should practice entry arrangements.
- Managements without large commercial buildings with over 1,000m should practice entry arrangements. (Establishments with 1000m or less, notbased on the law)
- Comply thoroughly with the per industry guidelines
- Prohibit the entrance of those who have symptoms such as a fever.
- •Refrain from holding events such as promotional sale events of daily necessities to attract customers on weekends.
- For prevention of infections, make information public through URLs regarding entry arrangements for prevention of transmission, etc.

Regarding a list of the facilities as on appendix 2, all of the usage will be suspended (including the use of their parking areas). (Unless any events that are planned already and no other alternative places can be implemented.)

### (3) Other facilities (Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law)

# 4. Request business operators regarding commuting to work, etc.

(Request based on Article 24, Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law)

- Regarding commuting to the workplace, we aim to reduce the number of employees present by 70% through utilizing teleworking and promoting the taking of holiday leave.
- Aim not to work after 8 pm unless absolutely necessary for business continuity.
- Even when traveling to work is necessary, we strongly promote efforts to reduce contact with other people through methods such as staggered work hours and bicycle commuting.
- Strongly stick to the infection prevention measures at work (appropriate ventilation, utilise video conferences to reduce business trips, countermeasures for communal spaces at apartments/housing for staff), take measures to avoid "3C's", the "five situations" where the risk of infection is increased.
- Be cautious when switching locations, such as when using break rooms, locker rooms, smoking rooms, etc.
- Practice per industry guidelines at work or at stores.
- For employees who are at risk of developing a serious illness from the infection, those who are pregnant, or those
  who have family member in such conditions, be aware of the infection risk and allow teleworking or staggered
  work hours based upon their request.

5. Requests to public transportation operators, etc.

(Not based on the Special Measures Law, but strongly encouraged)

- Request cooperation from transportation companies, such as subways and buses, to bring forward the times for the last trains, and carry out temperature measurements at major terminals.
- We request the business operators to cooperate with outdoor lighting arrangements (excluding those necessary for crime prevention measures) such as turning off any unnecessary lights at night.

Requests to universities, etc.

(Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law)

- Actively utilize online classes at universities, etc. to reduce the number of students coming to class at one time to 50% or less.
- Be sure to comply with university guidelines. In particular, take infection prevention measures such as
  introducing a permit system for students' extracurricular activities, canceling or postponing trip plans to other
  prefectures for competitions/games. If such a trip cannot be cancelled or postponed, confirm if prevention
  measures are being thoroughly conducted by the organizers, and conduct PCR testing in advance and confirm
  that the results are "negative" before going ahead.
- Cooperate with the COVID-19 monitoring tests, etc. at universities in the prefecture, which are being carried
  out by Kyoto Prefecture in cooperation with the national government.
- Refrain from dining with people before and after university classes and extracurricular activities.
   (Strictly comply with "Kyoto Manners")
- Thoroughly implement infection prevention measures at student dormitories.
- Alert students not to conduct the following:
  - No visiting restaurants or bars outside of their requested business hours
  - No partying with university club/circle members
  - No gathering with large groups and no drinking alcohol/staying overnight at a friend's home
  - No talking without a mask, even during a meal.

Requests to junior and senior high schools, etc.

(Requests based on Article 24 Clause 9 of the Special Measures Law)

- Based on the actual situation of each school regarding commuting to school, take infection prevention
  measures such as staggering commuting hours to avoid congestion times of public transportation to
  avoid crowded situations during commuting hours to school.
- Infection prevention measures regarding club activities in junior and senior high schools, including the
  activities being conducted only by students of each school, inside school premises, should be kept
  within 2 hours, and an accommodation ban should be thoroughly implemented.
- Regarding participation in official competitions and presentations which lead to Kinki (Kansai) regional
  or national competitions and in which sufficient infection prevention measures are taken, confirm with an
  organizer in advance that the infection prevention measures are being taken.
